Dear Parents

Many thanks to all who completed the online parent questionnaire recently. We had over 200 responses which is fantastic. The senior leadership team have begun to analyse the responses and feedback will be provided to parents after the Easter break.

General Housekeeping

Morning drop off

Children are expected to arrive at School in the morning between 8.35 a.m. and 8.44 a.m. Pupils should not be on site prior to 8.35am unless there is a club running which a child is attending. On wet days, could Key Stage 2 children use the Hall entrance and Key Stage 1 children the playground entrance.

In the interests of security, parents wishing to come onto the School site between 8.45 a.m. and 2.55 p.m. must report to the School Office. Please press bell and announce your name and purpose for the visit and the Secretary will release the electronic lock.

Parents who are helping in School must sign the "Visitors book" and will be issued with a badge. All parent helpers must be C.R.B. checked. If you are interested in helping in School, please see the secretary for a form if you need to apply.

Parents whose children are "late" for School or wish to take their child to an appointment (having previously told the class teacher) must report to the Secretary who will ask parents to record their child's entrance/exit from the School premises in a book.

Most importantly, only bona-fide visitors and parents wearing a badge are allowed in the School building during School hours. Staff will challenge anyone not wearing a badge on the School site.

The only exception will be when teachers invite parents into their classroom to discuss their child's welfare.

General Matters

Please enter the School via the pedestrian entrance. Walk on the tarmac footpath (keeping to the left hand side). Please do not walk on the grass to reach the playground. Children must not swing on the School metal gate or School fences for their own safety.

Please could I remind parents that in the interests of our children's safety, cars should not be driven on the pavement, parked on yellow lines or block neighbours entrances. (The School Car Park is for staff cars only.) Traffic Wardens and Community Support Workers have recently reported their concerns about illegal parking around Schools and will be making random checks.

Please ensure that your child is closely supervised at the end of the School day.

I should like to thank you in anticipation of your support in these matters. Due to the large number of pupils we have on roll, it is essential that we work together to ensure the safety of our children and to support the smooth running of the school.

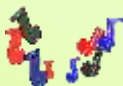


Friday 15th April 2016 at 3.00 pm
