Mrs Blake Mends for Muscular Dystrophy.

Do you have a favourite skirt with a broken zip? A torn pair of trousers or a dress with the hem down? Has your child put a hole in their PE shorts or has the button come off your winter coat? If your sewing skills are a bit thin or you think the fix is beyond your experience, there may be an answer.

As a part of her other life outside school, Mrs Blake volunteers at the Regeneration Café which is a repair café in Montpellier. Members of the public can bring in things that need fixing and a team of various specialists will try to fix them. Mrs Blake is a part of the sewing team. The aim is to try to reuse things and stop them going into landfill.

She has decided to offer her sewing fix-it service at school to raise money for Muscular Dystrophy as one of the charities this year. She will do mending in return for a contribution to the school for the charity. She will trial this up to February half term to see if it works!

So if you have something that needs a sewing fix, bring it along to her in Oak Class after the end of the day. She'll have a look and see what can be done.

For other types of non-sewing repairs why not take them along to the Regeneration Café, St Andrew's Church Hall, Montpellier 10-2 on the first Saturday of the month.
