Feedback Policy

At present, Leckhampton is undertaking a piece of school based research in order to ensure that the feedback adults give to the children as part of the teaching and learning process is as effective as it can possibly be. Research by Oxford University, as part of the Education Endowment Foundation's review on marking, states that there is "a significant disparity between the enormous amount of effort teachers invest in marking and the research available to tell them which marking approaches are the most effective." Sean Harford, HMI National Director of Education also adds that "There is remarkably little high-quality, relevant research evidence to suggest that detailed or extensive marking has any significant impact on pupils' learning."

As a result of the Department for Education's Workload Challenge Survey, schools are being asked to address ways in which they can ensure that teacher's time is being used effectively and on the most important aspect of their work – high quality teaching. Ofsted are also looking at the ways in which schools are addressing workload for their members of staff.

To this end, teachers are trialling a new method of marking. Feedback is given directly in the lesson, as opposed to providing lengthy comments in books, which we know have little to no impact long term on pupil progress.

Please be aware that when looking at your child's books at open evening, you may not see the volume of teacher comments you have previously. This does not mean that children's work has not been assessed; in fact more effective, research based assessment strategies are taking place in order to accelerate progress. We look forward to sharing the outcome of our research with you and what this will mean for our Feedback Policy for the future.
