## Contact Tracing during the February Half Term Holiday Period

The DfE have shared information and advice to schools on half term planning arrangements.

Part of this guidance states that schools should remain contactable within 48 hours of children being in school so that they can assist with contact tracing. In order to ensure we are able to fulfil this requirement, I would ask that parents carefully read the information below and respond accordingly. Parents must use the contact details outlined below. Please do not use other school email addresses as these may not be checked.

## Inside Out Day

Last week, we were really pleased to be part of the first Mental Health and Wellbeing Festival for Schools in the UK. Staff and children wore items of clothing inside out – some choosing their socks and others (including some teachers) all of their clothes!

We were lucky to be able to organise a workshop for every year group, and these included guided mindfulness sessions, creative ways to think about emotions and feelings and strategies to use to feel calm. It has been lovely that the organisers of the workshops have already been in touch to say how impressed they were by our children and how much they enjoyed working with us.

Children made gratitude boxes and gift boxes and thought about their strengths and emotions. Teachers were particularly moved by the open conversations they were able to have with children about their feelings. We all felt that the day was very successful, providing a welcome break in this very difficult time and we will continue to build on this learning over the coming months.

I hope you were able to see some of the activities that were going on, or have found some of the resources we have sent for adults and children of interest.

## **Curriculum update**

At the end of last term, two groups of pupils volunteered to take part in a curriculum review, led by two of our School Governors. The focus of the visit was for the Governors to see the impact of our Leckhampton curriculum on the children's learning.

Year 6 pupils from the Curriculum and Learning Ministry and a group of Year 5 pupils were invited to talk about different aspects of teaching and learning and to share specific aspects of the curriculum that they enjoyed. The meetings took place over Zoom and the children described their learning and shared examples of what they enjoyed about the curriculum. The children explained how they were introduced to new knowledge by their teachers and described some of the strategies they used to help them to remember key information. They reflected on how they were helped to improve, particularly when they found the learning tricky.

The children spoke very positively about the Leckhampton curriculum and were able to clearly articulate their knowledge and demonstrate their retention of key facts across a wide variety of curriculum subjects. They shared their ideas as to how we can improve the curriculum further, as well as clearly highlighting how much they value activities such as school visits to enrich their learning – the return of which we all agree can't come soon enough!

We are grateful to Ms Jane Allison and Mr Paul Harris for giving up their time to evaluate the curriculum from the children's perspective and our thanks go to the pupils who spoke so enthusiastically about our Leckhampton curriculum.
