Job Title: Learning Mentor (SEND) Teaching Partner

Salary Scale Point: Grade 5

Relationships

- The post holder is responsible and accountable to the Head Teacher and to suitably qualified staff allocated by the Head Teacher.

Job Purpose

- To work under the instruction/guidance of Inclusion Lead and teaching staff to undertake work/care/support programmes, to enable access to learning for all pupils. This may be delivered by supporting them in the classroom and by the implementation of 1:1 and small group interventions.

Generic Responsibilities:

- Supervise and provide particular support for pupils, including those with special needs, ensuring their safety and access to learning activities.
- Assist with the development and implementation of My Plans, Behaviour Plans and Personal Care programmes.
- Establish constructive relationships with pupils and interact with them according to individual needs.
- Promote the inclusion and acceptance of all pupils.
- Encourage pupils to interact with others and engage in classroom activities.
- Set challenging and demanding expectations and promote self-esteem and independence.
- Provide feedback to pupils in relation to progress and achievement under guidance of the teacher.
- Uphold the Code of Conduct of the School.

Specific Responsibilities

- Assist with the planning of and deliver targeted intervention programmes to individuals or small groups.
- Undertake baseline assessment and regular evaluation to track impact of interventions and progress of children.
- Organise opportunities to observe and support identified children within the classroom.
- Understand specific learning needs and establish positive relationships with pupils
- Provide feedback to pupils in line with School policy.
- Provide detailed and regular feedback to teachers on pupils' achievement, progress, problems etc in line with School policy.
- Promote good pupil behaviour, dealing promptly with conflict and incidents in line with established policy and encourage pupils to take responsibility for their own behaviour.
- Organise and lead lunchtime activities, liaise with member of SLT leading outdoor provision.
- Liaise with Inclusion Lead on progress of individuals, groups and the planning of provision
- Support Inclusion Lead with record keeping.
- To carry out any other duty which is deemed reasonable by the Head Teacher.

Support for the Curriculum

- Undertake structured and agreed learning activities/teaching programmes, adjusting activities according to pupil responses.
- Undertake programmes linked to local and national learning strategies eg. literacy, numeracy, early years, recording achievement and progress and feeding back to the teacher.
- Support the use of ICT in learning activities and develop pupils' competence and independence in its use.
- Prepare, maintain and use equipment/resources required to meet the lesson plans/relevant learning activity and assist pupils in their use.

Support for the School

- Be aware of and comply with policies and procedures especially those relating to child protection, health, safety and security, confidentiality and data protection, reporting all concerns to an appropriate person.
- Be aware of and support difference and ensure all pupils have equal access to opportunities to learn and develop.
- Contribute to the overall ethos/work/aims of the School.
- Appreciate and support the role of other professionals.
- Attend and participate in relevant meetings as required e.g. reviews.
- To actively and positively participate in staff development training opportunities and to seek to put new learning into practice.
- Assist with the supervision of pupils out of lesson times e.g. playtimes, lunchtimes.
- Accompany teaching staff and pupils on visits, trips and out of school activities as required and take responsibility for a group under the supervision of the teacher.
- Adopt confidentiality at all times.

Experience

- Experience of working with children in an educational setting.
- Experience of targeted support for Key Stage 2 pupils.
- Experience of working with neuro-diverse pupils and an understanding of effective strategies to support.

Qualifications

- Good numeracy/literacy skills.
- NVQ2 for Teaching Assistants or equivalent qualifications.

Willingness to acquire/develop knowledge and skills in these areas

- Effective use of ICT to support learning.
- Understanding of relevant policies/codes of practice and awareness of relevant legislation.
- General understanding of national/foundation stage curriculum and other basic learning programmes/strategies.
- Basic understanding of child development and learning.
- Ability to self-evaluate learning needs.
- Ability to relate well to children and adults.
- Work constructively as part of a team, understanding classroom roles and responsibilities and your own position within these.

Special Conditions

The postholder will be subject to an enhanced DBS disclosure and suitability check to satisfy child protection requirements. The post is exempt from the provisions of the Rehabilitation of Offenders Act and all convictions or cautions must be declared.

At all times ensure that priority is given to the safeguarding of young people and that Safeguarding Policies and Procedures are followed.
