Spring 1 Bronze Awards	
What was the idea?	Who made the change happen?
Improving the toilet facilities for Y5/6.	Miss Porter has ordered the necessary resources to make the Y5/6 toilets a little more welcoming.
Have a Spring Spruce where staff and parents cut back weeds and brambles and prepare for the growing season and outdoor learning.	The staff and parents were invited to attend a Spring Spruce on Saturday 11 <sup>th</sup> February.
Have a Buddy Bench for children who are looking for someone to play with.	Two Buddy Benches will be painted by Mr Kelsey.
Have litter-picking equipment available at break-times for pupils who wish to litter-pick.	Miss Manning & The Eco Ministry have organised for a container of litter-pickers and high visibility jackets to be kept out on the playground for children to access during break-times.
Encouraging pupils to tie back long hair.	A child created a poster and it is displayed in school.
Order new stationery for the Calm Zone.	Miss Porter ordered the new stationery for the Calm Zone.
A poster encouraging children to put toys away at break-times.	A child has designed a poster that is displayed in school to help encourage children to tidy away play equipment.
Have a mental health check-in poster in class.	A child has created a poster for the children in their class where they each place a post-it note with their name on in the place that suits their feelings.

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The house with the most house points each term have a day to dress up in their house colours.	A child suggested that the staff arrange a non-uniform day for the children in the winning house each term.
Helping younger children learn.	A group of Year 5 children are currently helping younger pupils in the woodland area.
More shelves outside for storing lunchboxes in year groups. Keep the lunchboxes tidy and organised.	Mr Kelsey has designed a new racking system for lunchboxes. Each year group will have a sign to show where their lunchboxes should go. In the meantime, pupils have been spending time organising and tidying the lunchboxes on the current shelves.
A well-being poster.	A child has created a well-being poster to celebrate the school's principle aim.
Encouraging people to label clothes and improve the lost property system.	Children have created posters about labelling clothes and spent time sorting through lost items trying to return them their owners.
Pick up litter outside of school.	A child and their family went out and collected litter.
Cleaning milk cups at lunchtime.	A child has been cleaning the milk cups for her class.
Be Friendship Helpers.	Two children have made new friends and the playground is now a happier place.
Create more habitats for mini-beasts.	A child made a mini-beast hotel and it is situated in a tree in the Conservation Area.
