



Dear Parents

As the Spring Term draws to a close, we would like to share some recent news and upcoming events with you.

It has been a busy and exciting term for the children and staff with much to celebrate.

Between 11 – 15th March we saw our very first "Science Week". Our Science lead, Mrs Connolley, worked incredibly hard to devise a week of activities which were designed to motivate pupils and promote the place of science not only in school but in the wider world. We had a number of parents visiting the school and talking to children about the role that science has in their work. The presentations were engaging and inspiring and it is clear that a huge amount of work went into preparing for the sessions. We are truly fortunate to have such a skilled parent body and we look forward to seeking ways in which we can build on this highly successful event.

The annual house music competition took place this week and each of our six houses performed to the school and votes were cast. This is a much loved event and an opportunity for our Year 6 Captains to demonstrate their leadership skills as well as an understanding of our school values. Sport continues to play a huge part in the life of Leckhampton and several tournaments and festivals have taken place. Most notably, four of our cross country runners were selected to represent Gloucestershire in the National Championships recently, an accolade which has never been achieved previously. We were treated to our Year 3 Performance of Peter Pan in February. We are fortunate to have such talented staff and pupils and incredible resources, enabling us to put on such special events for our families. The children adore performing and many memories are made on such evenings. World Book Day also took place this term. The children dressed as their favourite characters and many members of staff were almost unrecognisable in their costumes. Our Old School Hall was transformed into a very special candlelit reading room where Miss Bird, Mrs Taylor and I read to each year group. It was a magical experience – especially for us!
